WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

*Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. Full music hymn books or large print hymn books are available from the sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns and Mass music by number**. The text of the liturgies is by page number at the back of the book.*

*All who are baptised with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive Holy Communion in the Anglican Church. At the time of Communion you may receive bread and wine OR bread only. However, **intinction (dipping bread into the wine) is no longer allowed**. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.*

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons. Hand sanitizers for your use are available on both sides of the church near the centre door.

OUR PARISH COMMUNITY

- **Children's Program during the 11.00 Mass:** Recently, I met with a couple of parents who participate regularly in the Solemn Mass to discuss the need for an educational program for young children during this liturgy. Our vision is for an interactive and engaging young children's program that would begin at the time of the first reading and conclude in time for the children to rejoin their families for the Eucharist. In order to realize this vision, **we need a minimum of four individuals in the parish who feel they have the gifts to lead or to contribute in some way to this effort.** This team of four would share in the offering of the program, with two scheduled each Sunday. SMM currently owns a curriculum which follows the **Seasons of the Church Year; leaders would receive the necessary support and training to offer this program.** Please seriously consider this need for our parish community as it would be a vital part of reaching out and supporting families with young children in their lives of faith.
