Psalm 19 *(please sit at midpoint of verse one)*



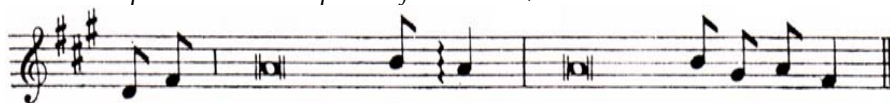
1 THE HEA-vens declare the **glo-ry** of God : and the firmament showeth **his** han-dy-work.

- **Celebration of New Ministry:** The induction of Fr David Harrison will take place on Sunday 19 September at 4.00 pm.

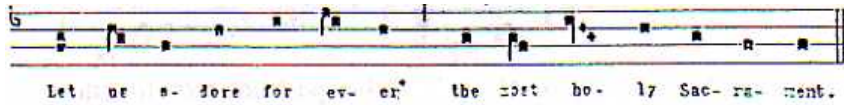
