Gradual: *I will always give thanks unto the Lord: his praise shall ever be in my mouth. My soul shall make her boast in the Lord: the humble shall consider this, and be glad.*

Second Reading: Colossians 3: 1-11

Alleluia: *Alleluia. O Lord God of my salvation, I have cried day and night before thee. Alleluia.*

Offertory Hymn 275 (small green book) LIEBSTER JESU
(Please sit when the hymn is finished)

Offertory Sentence: *And then Moses, Servant of God, besought the Lord his God, and spake unto him, saying 'Why, O Lord, waxeth thy wrath so hot against thy people? Turn from wrath and thy fierce anger: remember Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob, to whom thou swarest to give a land flowing with milk and honey. And the Lord repented him of the evil which he had thought to do unto his chosen, even his own people.*

Motet: *O Sacrum Convivium* CROCE

O sacrum convivium, in quo Christus sumitur recolitur memoria passionis ejus; mens impletur gratia, et futurae gloriae nobis pignus datur. Alleluja. (O sacred banquet wherein Christ is received: the memory of his passion is renewed: the soul with grace is filled: and pledge of future glory is bestowed.)

(Stand as the thurifer approaches to cense the congregation; remain standing until the end of the Sanctus.)

Intention of the Mass

Priest: Pray that this my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

People: The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.
