All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

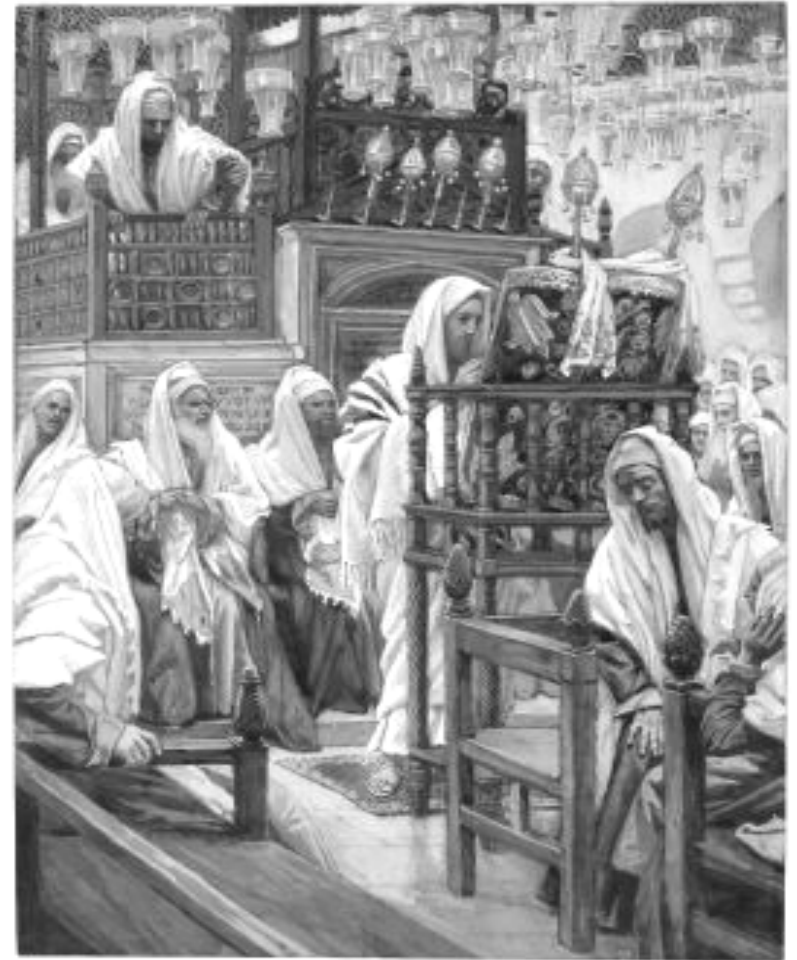

- **PREAUTHORIZED GIVINGS (PAG) and ONCE a MONTH giving:**
As we enter a new fiscal year, the Wardens would ask that parishioners give serious consideration to moving to Preauthorized Givings (PAG). Many of you may not be aware of the challenges faced managing the counting of givings on a weekly basis. There are many advantages to the parish, not least of all a predictable cash flow, that accompanies more people participating in PAG. For parishioners, there is the convenience of a regular automatic withdrawal on a monthly basis. PAG forms have been included in this week's leaflets. Once completed, they should be given to one of the Wardens or to David Greig, our envelope secretary, along with a void cheque. If you join this program, your current envelope number will change to a "700" number.
Our system also can consider having parishioners make their giving only once per month but through the envelope system. This also reduces the amount of time counting on a weekly basis and may be useful for some parishioners too. If you would like to make this change, we will give you a smaller set of envelopes and your number will change to a "500" series number. Thanks so much for considering making these changes.
