This evening we welcome back to SMM as our preacher the **Reverend Joan Waters-Garner**. Joan's father, being a huge fan of Healey Willan, brought her to the Monday evening choir recitals in the late 1940s. Joan was a member of the Gallery Choir from 1952 to 1956, and then continued her life as a church musician, ending up as the Organist and Choirmaster of the Church of the Epiphany, Scarborough for over twenty years, as well as deputizing for Dr. Willan as the Acting Director of the Gregorian Association. Joan and her first husband, the late Bart Waters, were married here in 1954 by Fr. Crummer. Ordained in 1983, she served as rector of the Parish of Penetanguishine and St. Andrew's, Scarborough. Joan has recently concluded a four-year stint as director of music at St. Nicholas, Birch Cliff.

After all have received communion, we sit in silent thanksgiving.

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *The souls of the righteous are in the hand of God, and there shall no torment touch them: in the sight of the unwise they seemed to die: but they are in peace, alleluia.*

Exultate, justi, in Domino; rectos decet collaudatio, confitemini Domino in cithara, in psalterio decem cordarum. Cantate ei canticum novum, bene psalite in vociferatione. (Rejoice in the Lord, O ye just; it is fitting for the righteous to give praise together. Make know the Lord with the zither; praise him with the ten-string psaltery. Sing to him a new song; sing praises to him well in a loud voice.)

Celebrant: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

People **The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.**

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue SMM Book No. 116*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer A. You may follow the text on page 143 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue SMM Book.
