- **Advent Study:** The Wednesday night Advent study has been cancelled owing to lack of participation.

OUTREACH & SOCIAL JUSTICE:

- ***Hands Across the Sands*:** The refugee team met on Tuesday and chose to **sponsor a family of four, currently living in a refugee camp in Lebanon. The family is composed of a husband, wife and two adult children.** A third child, also an adult, is living in Detroit, but will not be part of our sponsorship. The family fled Iraq, and they are recognized refugees due to persecution on the basis of their ethnicity and faith, which is Chaldean Christianity. Due to privacy restrictions we cannot divulge further details about their profile. However, we can say that **we were deeply moved by their plight, and felt that, of the three profiles we considered, we could be most helpful to this family.** Although we can't be certain, at present our best guess is that **the family will arrive in early January.** Our plan is to look now for **interim accommodation of two or three weeks, beginning with their arrival.** Any suggestions for short term housing would be most welcome. Furniture and household items will be useful once we have secured a more permanent apartment. (Please speak to Richard, Wendy, Catherine, Sally-Beth or Fr. Paul.). We feel both excited and privileged to have taken this step. There will be many challenges ahead. In the meantime, **we can make our preparations for the family's arrival and pray for their safety and journey.**
