The Celebration of the Eucharist

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *Mary is taken up into heaven: the angels rejoice, they praise and bless the Lord, alleluia.*

The Great Thanksgiving (Music: Blue SMM Book No. 116)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**
Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.
People: It is meet and right so do to.

Sanctus

holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most
high. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.*)

Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.

At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:

**All: Our Father, who art in heaven:
Hallowed be thy name:
Thy Kingdom come:
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the Kingdom,
the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**
