Celebrant: The Lord be with you. **People: And also with you.**
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. **People: We lift them to the Lord.**
Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The celebrant continues to pray the Eucharistic Prayer.

Holy, Holy, Holy (*Music: Blue Common Praise Hymn Book No. 719*)

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
