The Gathering of the Community

Introit Hymn: Christ is Atonement, the Paschal Victim (*Insert*)

Celebrant: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

People: **The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

Celebrant: May his grace and peace be with you.

People: **May he fill our hearts with joy.**

Glory to God (*Music: Blue Book No. 86*)

- Glory to God and highest praise,
our voices now in joy we raise;
Peace to the earth in all our days!
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!**

2. Lord God almighty, heav'nly King;
Worship and thanks to you we bring;
Praise for your glory now we sing.
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia!
3. Lord Jesus Christ, the only Son,
O Lamb of God, the Chosen One,
You have in death the battle won.
Alleluia, alleluia, alleluia.

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Acts 2: 42-47

Lector: *Eva Martin*

Lector: The word of the Lord.

People: **Thanks be to God.**

Psalm 23

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- C. THE LÓRD is my shep-herd : I shall not be in want.
P. He makes me lie dówn in green pas-tures : and leads me beside still wa-ters.
C. Hé re-vives my soul : and guides me along right pathways for his name's sake.
P. **Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death I shall fear no e-vil : for you are with me, your rod and your staff they com-fort me.**

The Communion

The community gathers in the aisles to receive communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms across your chest. We remain standing until all have received communion, and then return to our places and sit in silent thanksgiving.

Hymn: Dear Shepherd of your People, Hear *(Insert)*

The Sending Forth of the Community

The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.

Celebrant: Glory to God,
All: **whose power, working in us,
can do infinitely more
than we can ask or imagine.
Glory to God from generation to generation,
in the Church and in Christ Jesus,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

The celebrant blesses the people, after which all sit for the notices and announcements.

The celebrant dismisses the people, to which all respond:

Thanks be to God. Alleluia. Alleluia.

Dismissal *(Music: Blue Book No.91)*

**Thanks be to God, alleluia! Thanks be to God, alleluia!
Thanks be to God, alleluia! Thanks be to God, alleluia!**

Second Reading: I Peter 2: 19-25

Lector: *Heather McGregor*

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Sequence Hymn 457 *(Green hymn book)*

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Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And also with you.**
Celebrant: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to John.
People: **Glory to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Gospel Reading: John 10: 1-10

Celebrant: The Gospel of Christ. People: **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

The Homily: Fr David Harrison

We sit in silent reflection. Please stand when the celebrant stands.

The Apostles' Creed

Celebrant: Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,
All: **I believe in God, the Father almighty,
creator of heaven and earth.
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit
and born of the Virgin Mary.
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,
was crucified, died, and was buried.
He descended to the dead.
On the third day he rose again,
He ascended into heaven,
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.
He will come again
to judge the living and the dead.
I believe in the Holy Spirit,
the holy catholic Church,
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,
the resurrection of the body,
and the life everlasting. Amen.**

The Prayers of the People

The people's response to the prayer will be announced by the Leader.

The Peace

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you. People: **And also with you.**

We share a sign of God's peace by a handshake with our neighbours.

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Offertory Hymn 101 (*Green hymn book – omit verses 5 and 6*) DEUS TUORUM MILITUM

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church.

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue Book No. 87*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And also with you.**
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them to the Lord.**
Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.
People: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic #1. You may follow the text on page 129 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.

Holy, Holy, Holy (*Music: Blue Book No. 88*)

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.
Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest!
Blest is he who comes in the name of the Lord.
Hosanna in the highest, hosanna in the highest!**

Please remain standing or kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.

Therefore, Father, according to his command,
...we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming in glory;

At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.

The Lord's Prayer (*Music: Blue Book No. 89*)

Celebrant: As our Saviour taught us let us pray.
All: **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,
your kingdom come, your will be done,
on earth as in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread,
Forgive us our sins,
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial.
And deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours,
now and forever. Amen.**

The Breaking of the Bread

Celebrant: Lord, we died with you on the cross.
All: **Now we are raised to new life.**
Celebrant: We were buried in your tomb.
All: **Now we share in your resurrection.**
Celebrant: Live in us, that we may live in you.

Celebrant: The gifts of God for the People of God.
People: **Thanks be to God.**

The Disciples Knew The Lord (*Music: Blue Book No. 90*)

Refrain: The disciples knew the Lord Jesus in the breaking of the bread.

1. The bread which we break, alleluia, is the communion in the body of Christ.
2. One body are we, alleluia, for though many, we share one bread.
