Welcome to the Church of St. Mary Magdalene.

We hope that the liturgy will assist you in prayer and the worship of God. This parish's liturgical tradition is centred in the richness of the catholic expression within the Anglican tradition. This order of service will help you participate in the celebration of the mass.

Hymns are taken either from the **green hymn book** in the pews or from the **blue book** you have been given. **Service music** is also found in the blue book and the texts are printed in this leaflet. All who are baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive Holy Communion in the Anglican Church.

Prelude: *Concerto Grosso No.4 in sol minore Allegro ma non troppo*

Domenico Scarlatti

Vidi Aquam (*Music: Blue Book No. 108*)

Please stand and kneel with the Sacred Ministers.

During the Vidi Aquam the people are sprinkled with holy water.

Celebrant: I beheld water

All: **which proceeded from the temple, on the right side thereof, alleluia: and all they to whom that water came were healed everyone, and they say, alleluia, alleluia.**

Cantor: O give thanks unto the Lord, for he is gracious:

All: **and his mercy endureth forever.**

Cantor: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Ghost

All: **As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.**

All: **I beheld water which proceeded from the temple,
on the right side thereof, alleluia:
and all they to whom that water came were healed everyone,
and they say, alleluia, alleluia.**

Celebrant: O Lord, show thy mercy upon us, alleluia.

People: **And grant us thy salvation, alleluia.**

Celebrant: O Lord, hear my prayer. People: **And let my cry come unto thee.**

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy Spirit.**

The celebrant prays the Collect for Holy Protection.

Introit: *O sing unto the Lord a new song, alleluia: for the Lord hath done marvellous things, alleluia: in the sight of the nations hath he showed his righteous judgements, alleluia, alleluia. Ps. With his own right hand and with his holy arm: hath he gotten himself the victory. Glory be ...*

Celebrant: Alleluia! Christ is risen.

People: **The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!**

Celebrant: May his grace and peace be with you.

People: **May he fill our hearts with joy.**

Lord have mercy, Christ have mercy, Lord have mercy.

Gloria in Excelsis (*Music: Blue Book No. 115*)

*The congregation sings the words in **bold**.*

Glory be to God on high,

And in earth peace, good will towards men.

We praise thee, **We bless thee,**

We worship thee, **We glorify thee,**

We give thanks to thee for thy great glory.

O Lord God, heavenly King, God the Father Almighty.

O Lord, the only begotten Son, Jesu Christ.

O Lord God Lamb of God, Son of the Father,

That takest away the sin of the world, have mercy upon us.

Thou that takest away the sin of the world, receive our prayer.

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the Kingdom,
the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;
People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast. Alleluia!**

Agnus Dei Mass for Four Voices – William Byrd
*O Lamb of God, that takest away the sin of the world: have mercy upon us.
O Lamb of God, that takest away the sin of the world: grant us thy peace.*

The Communion

You may stand or kneel to receive communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms across your chest.

Communion Sentence: Ego sum vitis vera et vos palmites, qui manet in me, et ego in eo, hic fert fructum multum, alleluia, alleluia. (*I am the true vine and you are the branches, he who abides in me, and I in him, he it is that bears much fruit.*) Choir: Psalm 80

After all have received communion, we sit in silent thanksgiving.

The Sending Forth of the Community

The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.

Celebrant: Glory to God,
All: **whose power, working in us,
can do infinitely more than we can ask or imagine.
Glory to God from generation to generation,
in the Church and in Christ Jesus,
for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: Let us pray. *The celebrant prays the Collect of the Day.*

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Acts 7: 55-60 *Lector: Patricia Maltby*

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Alleluia. *Alleluia. The right hand of the Lord bringeth mighty things to pass: the right hand of the Lord hath exalted me. Alleluia. Alleluia.*

Second Reading: I Peter 2: 2-10 *Lector: Reed Nelson*

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Alleluia: *Alleluia. Christ being raised from the dead now dieth no more: death hath no more dominion over him. Alleluia.*

Sequence Hymn 118 (*Green hymn book*) NARENZA

Deacon: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**
Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ to John.
People: **Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

Gospel Reading: John 14: 1-14

Deacon: The Gospel of Christ. People: **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

The Homily: Fr William Cruse

We sit in silent reflection. Please stand when those in the sanctuary stand.

The Nicene Creed (*Music: Blue Book No. 114*)

Celebrant: I believe in one God,
**the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth,
and of all things visible, and invisible.
And in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the only begotten Son of God.
Begotten of the Father before all worlds.
God of God, Light of Light, Very God of very God.
Begotten, not made, Being of one substance with the Father:**

**Through whom all things were made. Who for us men,
and for our salvation, came down from heaven,**

Please bow while the choir sings: And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary:
and was made man.

**And was crucified also for us: under Pontius Pilate.
He suffered, and was buried.
And the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures.
And ascended into heaven:
And sitteth on the right hand of the Father.
And he shall come again with glory,
to judge both the quick and the dead:
Whose kingdom shall have no end.
And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the Giver of life:
Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son.
Who with the Father and the Son
together is worshipped and glorified:
Who spake by the Prophets.
And I believe in one Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church.
I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins.
And I look for the Resurrection of the dead,
and the Life of the world to come. Amen.**

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Offertory Hymn 122 (*Green hymn book*)

MACH'S MIT MIR GOTT

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *O be joyful in God, all ye lands: sing praises unto him, and tell the honour of his holy name: O come hither and hearken all ye that fear God, and I will tell you what the Lord hath done for my soul, alleluia.*

Motet: *Ave Verum Corpus*

Ave, verum corpus natum de Maria Virgine: vere passum immolatum in cruce pro homine: cujus unda fluxit et sanguine, esto nobis praegustatum in mortis examine. O dulcis, O pie, O Jesu, Fili Mariae, Miserere nobis. Amen. (*Hail the true body, born of the Virgin Mary: You who truly suffered and were sacrificed on the cross for the sake of man. From whose pierced flank flowed water and blood: Be a foretaste for us in the trial of death.*) (*O tender, O loving, O Jesu Son of Mary; have mercy on me.*)

Celebrant: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

People: **The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.**

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue Book No. 116*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**
Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.
People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer A. You may follow the text on page 143 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.

Sanctus

Mass for Four Voices – William Byrd

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.

At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.
