## THE APOSTLES' CREED

*Please stand. We are sprinkled with water to remind us of our baptisms.*

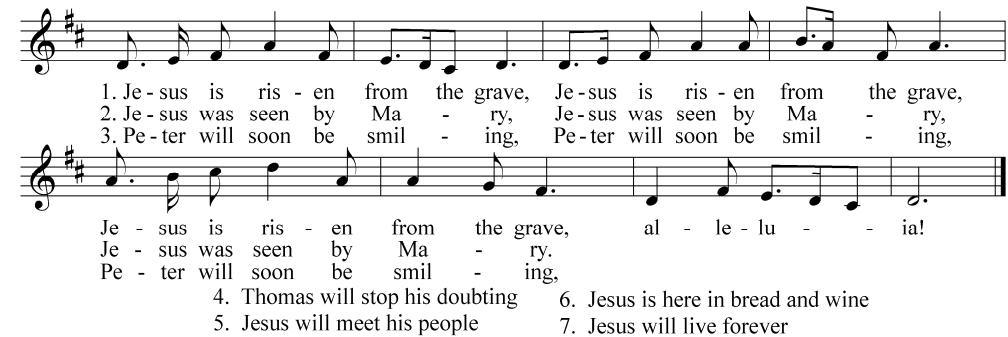
**Refrain:** Dance, then wherever you may be;

### COMMUNION

All baptised Christians are invited to share in the bread and wine of Holy Communion, or the bread only. If you would rather receive a blessing instead of the Sacrament, signify your intention by crossing your arms in front of your chest. If you do not wish to receive the chalice you may do the same. Please remain in the circle around the altar until the conclusion of the Mass.

**Celebrant:** Let us pray. God of life, bring us to the glory of the resurrection promised in this Easter sacrament. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ, the Risen Lord.

**People:** Amen.
