### The Litany in Procession

**R: Have mercy upon us.**

V: O God the Son, Redeemer of the world:

**R: Have mercy upon us.**

V: O God the Holy Ghost, Sanctifier of the faithful:

**R: Have mercy upon us.**

V: O holy, blessed and glorious Trinity, three Persons and one God:

**R: Have mercy upon us.**

V: Holy Mary, Mother of God our Saviour:

**R: Pray for us.**

V: All ye holy angels and archangels, and all ye holy orders of blessed spirits:

**R: Pray for us.**

V: All ye holy patriarchs and prophets, apostles, martyrs and confessors, virgins, and all the blessed company of heaven:

*Lector:* The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

*Tract:* *Whoso dwelleth under the defence of the most High, shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. V. I will say unto the Lord: Thou art my hope, and my strong hold, my God in thee will I trust. V. He shall deliver thee from the snare of the hunter, and from the noisome pestilence. V. ## The Nicene Creed (Music: Blue Book No. 113)

Celebrant: I believe in one God,  
**the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth,  
and of all things visible, and invisible.  
And in one Lord Jesus Christ,  
the only begotten Son of God.  
Begotten of the Father before all worlds.  
God of God, Light of Light, Very God of very God.  
Begotten, not made, Being of one substance with the Father:  
Through whom all things were made. Who for us men,  
and for our salvation, came down from heaven,**

*Please bow while the choir sings:* And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary:  
and was made man.

**And was crucified also for us: under Pontius Pilate.  
He suffered, and was buried.  
And the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures.  
And ascended into heaven:  
And sitteth on the right hand of the Father.  
And he shall come again with glory,  
to judge both the quick and the dead:  
Whose kingdom shall have no end.  
And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the Giver of life:  
Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son.  
Who with the Father and the Son

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.  
People: **And with thy spirit.**

*We share a sign of God's peace by a handshake with our neighbours.*

### **The Celebration of the Eucharist**

#### **Offertory Hymn 59** *(small green book)*

*During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.*

**Offertory Sentence:** *The Lord shall defend thee under his wings, and thou shalt be safe under his feathers: his faithfulness and his truth shall be thy shield and buckler.*

**Motet:** O Lord in thy wrath Gibbons  
*O Lord, in thy wrath rebuke me not, neither chasten me in thy displeasure. Have mercy upon me, O Lord, for I am weak: O Lord, heal me, for my bones are vexed. My soul is also sore troubled: but, Lord, how long wilt thou punish me? O save me for thy mercy's sake.*

Celebrant: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.  
People: **The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.**

*The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.*

#### **The Great Thanksgiving** *(Music: Blue Book No. 116)*

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**  
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**  
Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.  
People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

*The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer A. You may follow the text on page 143 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.*

#### **Sanctus**

*Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.*

*Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.*

**We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.**

*At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.*

#### **The Lord's Prayer** *(Music: Blue Book No. 117)*

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:  
All: **Our Father, who art in heaven:  
Hallowed be thy name:  
Thy Kingdom come:  
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.  
Give us this day our daily bread.  
And forgive us our trespasses,  
as we forgive those who trespass against us.  
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.  
For thine is the Kingdom,  
the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;  
People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast.**

#### **Prayer of Humble Access**

Celebrant: We do not presume  
All: **to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord,  
Trusting in our own righteousness,  
but in thy manifold and great mercies.  
We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table.  
But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy:  
Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,  
so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood,  
That we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.**
