### The Gathering of the Community

## The Sending Forth of the Community

*The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.*

Celebrant: Glory to God,  
All: whose power, working in us,

*The celebrant blesses the people, after which all sit for the notices and announcements.*

*The celebrant dismisses the people, to which all respond:*

**Thanks be to God.**

## The Apostles' Creed

Celebrant: Let us confess the faith of our baptism, as we say,  
All: **I believe in God, the Father almighty,  
creator of heaven and earth.  
I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.  
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit  
and born of the Virgin Mary.  
He suffered under Pontius Pilate,  
was crucified, died, and was buried.  
He descended to the dead.  
On the third day he rose again,  
He ascended into heaven,  
and is seated at the right hand of the Father.  
He will come again  
to judge the living and the dead.  
I believe in the Holy Spirit,  
the holy catholic Church,  
the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins,  
the resurrection of the body,

## Confession and Absolution

*The celebrant invites the people to confession. Please kneel or remain standing.*

Celebrant: Most merciful God,  
All: we confess that we have sinned against you  
in thought, word, and deed,  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.  
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us,

**that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways,  
to the glory of your name. Amen.**

*The celebrant pronounces absolution, after which all stand.*

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you. People: **And also with you.**

*We share a sign of God's peace by a handshake with our neighbours.*

## **The Celebration of the Eucharist**

**Offertory Hymn: *Restore in Us, O God* (see insert)**

*During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church.*

*The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.*

**The Great Thanksgiving** (*Music: Blue Book No. 80*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And also with you.**  
Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them to the Lord.**  
Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
People: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic #3. You may follow the text on page 131 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.*

**Holy, Holy, Holy** (*Music: Blue Book No. 81*)

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosanna in the highest.**

*Please remain standing or kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.*

Therefore, Father, according to his command,

*At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.*

**The Lord's Prayer** (*Music: Blue Book No. 82*)

Celebrant: As our Saviour taught us let us pray.  
All: **Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come, your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.  
Give us today our daily bread,  
Forgive us our sins,  
as we forgive those who sin against us.  
Save us from the time of trial.  
And deliver us from evil.  
For the kingdom, the power and the glory are yours,  
now and forever. Amen.**

**The Breaking of the Bread**

Celebrant: We break this bread,  
All: **Communion in Christ's body once broken.**  
Celebrant: Let your Church be the wheat which bears its fruit in dying.  
All: **If we have died with him, we shall live with him;  
if we hold firm, we shall reign with him.**

**The Communion**

Celebrant: The gifts of God for the People of God.  
People: **Thanks be to God.**
