The Gathering of the Community

Asperges Me (*Music: Blue Book No. 107*)

Please stand and kneel with the Sacred Ministers.

During the Asperges Me the people are sprinkled with holy water.

Celebrant: Thou shalt purge me,

All: **O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean:**

Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Cantor: Have mercy upon me, O God:

All: **after thy great goodness.**

Cantor: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Ghost

All: **As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be:
world without end. Amen.
Thou shalt purge me, O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean:
Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.**

Celebrant: O Lord, show thy mercy upon us. People: **And grant us thy salvation.**
Celebrant: O Lord, hear my prayer. People: **And let my cry come unto thee.**
Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy Spirit.**

The celebrant prays the Collect for Holy Protection.

Introit: *Rejoice ye with Jerusalem; and be ye glad for her, all ye that delight in her: exult and sing for joy with her, all ye that in sadness mourn for her: that ye may suck, and be satisfied with the breasts of her consolations. Ps. I was glad when they said unto me: we will go into the house of the Lord. Glory be ...*

Celebrant: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God,
and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.
People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Let us pray. *The celebrant prays the Collect of the Day.*

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: I Samuel 16: 1-13 *Lector:* Patricia Moffatt

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Gradual: *I was glad when they said unto me: we will go into the house of the Lord. V. Peace be within thy walls: and plenteousness within thy palaces.*

Second Reading: Ephesians 5: 8-14 *Lector:* Connie Phillipson

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Tract: *They that trust in the Lord are as Mount Syon: which may never be removed, but standeth fast for ever. V. As the mountains are round about Jerusalem: even so the Lord is round about his people, from henceforth, even for evermore.*

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:
All: **Our Father, who art in heaven:
Hallowed be thy name:
Thy Kingdom come:
Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread.
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.
And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
For thine is the Kingdom,
the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.**

Celebrant: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;
People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast.**

Prayer of Humble Access

Celebrant: We do not presume
All: **to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord,
Trusting in our own righteousness,
but in thy manifold and great mercies.
We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table.
But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy:
Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,
so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood,
That we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.**

Agnus Dei

*O Lamb of God, that takest away the sin of the world: have mercy upon us.
O Lamb of God, that takest away the sin of the world: grant us thy peace.*

The Communion

You may stand or kneel to receive communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms across your chest.

Communion Sentence: *Lutum fecit ex sputo Dominus, et linivit oculos meos: et abii, et lavi, et vidi, et credidi Deo.* (The Lord made clay of the spittle and anointed my eyes. I went and washed and received my sight and believed in God.)

Deacon: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**
Deacon: The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ to Matthew
People: **Glory be to thee, O Lord.**

Gospel Reading: John 9: 1-41

Deacon: The Gospel of Christ. People: **Praise be to thee, O Christ.**

The Homily: Canon Maylanne Maybee

We sit in silent reflection. Please stand when those in the sanctuary stand.

The Nicene Creed *(Music: Blue Book No. 113)*

Celebrant: I believe in one God,
**the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth,
and of all things visible, and invisible.
And in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the only begotten Son of God.
Begotten of the Father before all worlds.
God of God, Light of Light, Very God of very God.
Begotten, not made, Being of one substance with the Father:
Through whom all things were made. Who for us men,
and for our salvation, came down from heaven,**

Please bow while the choir sings: And was incarnate by the Holy Ghost of the Virgin Mary:
and was made man.

**And was crucified also for us: under Pontius Pilate.
He suffered, and was buried.
And the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures.
And ascended into heaven:
And sitteth on the right hand of the Father.
And he shall come again with glory,
to judge both the quick and the dead:
Whose kingdom shall have no end.
And I believe in the Holy Ghost, the Lord, the Giver of life:
Who proceedeth from the Father and the Son.
Who with the Father and the Son
together is worshipped and glorified:
Who spake by the Prophets.
And I believe in one Holy Catholic and Apostolic Church.**

**I acknowledge one Baptism for the remission of sins.
And I look for the Resurrection of the dead,
and the Life of the world to come. Amen.**

The Prayers of the People

The people's response to the prayers will be announced by the Deacon.

Confession and Absolution

The Deacon invites the people to confession. Please kneel.

Sub-deacon: Almighty God
**Father of our Lord Jesus Christ,
maker of all things and judge of all people:
we acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness,
which we from time to time most grievously have committed,
by thought, word and deed, against thy divine majesty.
We do earnestly repent,
and are heartily sorry for these our misdoings.
Have mercy upon us, most merciful Father;
for thy Son our Lord Jesus Christ's sake,
forgive us all that is past; and grant that we may ever hereafter
serve and please thee in newness of life,
to the honour and glory of thy name;
through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.**

The celebrant pronounces absolution, after which all stand.

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you.
People: **And with thy spirit.**

We share a sign of God's peace by a handshake with our neighbours.

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Offertory Hymn 392 *(Green hymn book)*

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *O praise ye the Lord, for the Lord is gracious: O sing praises unto his name, for it is lovely: whatsoever the Lord pleased, that did he in heaven and in earth.*

Motet: Ubi Caritas

Maurice Duruflé

Ubi Caritas et amor, Deus ibi est. Congregavit nos in unum Christi amor Exsultemus et in ipso iucundemur. Timeamus et amemus Deum vivum. Et ex corde diligamus nos sincero. (Where charity and love are, there is God. The love of Christ hath gathered us together in one. Let us rejoice and be glad in him. Let us fear and love the living God. And love one another in sincerity of heart.)

Celebrant: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

People: **The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.**

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving *(Music: Blue Book No. 116)*

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer B. You may follow the text on page 145 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.

Sanctus

Holy, holy, holy, Lord God of Hosts, heaven and earth are full of thy glory. Glory be to thee, O Lord most high. Blessed is he that cometh in the name of the Lord: Hosanna in the highest.

Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.

At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.
