All who are baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive Holy Communion in the Anglican Church.

The Gathering of the Community

Asperges Me (*Music: Blue Book No. 107*)

Please stand and kneel with the Sacred Ministers.

During the Asperges Me the people are sprinkled with holy water.

Celebrant: Thou shalt purge me,

All: **O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean:**

Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.

Cantor: Have mercy upon me, O God:

All: **after thy great goodness.**

Cantor: Glory be to the Father, and to the Son,
and to the Holy Ghost

All: **As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be:
world without end. Amen.
Thou shalt purge me, O Lord, with hyssop, and I shall be clean:
Thou shalt wash me, and I shall be whiter than snow.**

Celebrant: O Lord, show thy mercy upon us. People: **And grant us thy salvation.**
Celebrant: O Lord, hear my prayer. People: **And let my cry come unto thee.**
Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy Spirit.**

The celebrant prays the Collect for Holy Protection.

Introit: *Give sentence with me, O Lord, and defend the cause of my soul against the ungodly people: deliver me, and rid me from the deceitful and wicked man: for thou, O Lord, art my God, and my strong salvation. Ps. O send out thy light and thy truth, that they may lead me: and bring me unto thy holy hill, and to thy dwelling.*

Celebrant: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, and the love of God,
and the fellowship of the Holy Spirit, be with you all.
People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Let us pray. *The celebrant prays the Collect of the Day.*

The Proclamation of the Word

First Reading: Ezekiel 37: 1-14 *Lector:* Jo-Ann Dawson

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Gradual: *Deliver me, O Lord, from mine enemies: teach me to do the thing that pleaseth thee, O Lord. V.
It is thou, Lord, that savest me from my cruel enemies: and settest me up above mine adversaries: thou
shalt rid me from the wicked man.*

Second Reading: Romans 8: 6-11

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Tract: *Many a time have they fought against me from my youth up. V. Let Israel now say: Many a time
have they fought against me from my youth up. V. Yet have they not prevailed against me: the plowers*

Communion Sentence: *Videns Dominus flentes sorores Lazari ad monumentum, lacrimatus est coram
Iudaeis, et clamabat: Lazare, veni foras: et prodiit ligatis manibus et pedibus, qui fuerat quatrduanus
mortuus.* (When the Lord saw the sisters of Lazarus weeping at the tomb, he wept before
the Jews and cried out: Lazarus, come forth: and the man who had been dead four days
came out, his hands and feet bound with bandages.)

Hymn 507 Lenten Prose (*Green hymn book - please join in singing the refrain.*)

After all have received communion, we sit in silent thanksgiving.

The Sending Forth of the Community

The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.

The celebrant blesses the people, after which follow any notices and announcements.

Dismissal (*Music: Blue Book No. 120*)

Deacon: Depart in peace.
People: **Thanks be to God.**

Celebrant: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;
People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast.**

Prayer of Humble Access

Celebrant: We do not presume
All: **to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord,
Trusting in our own righteousness,
but in thy manifold and great mercies.
We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table.
But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy:
Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,
so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood,
That we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.**

The Celebration of the Eucharist

Offertory Hymn 383 (*Green hymn book*)

ABERYSTWYTH

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *I will give thanks unto thee, O Lord, with my whole heart: O do well unto thy servant, that I may live, and keep thy word: quicken thou me according unto thy word, O Lord.*

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue Book No. 116*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer A. You may follow the text on page 143 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.
