The Solemn Liturgy of Maundy Thursday

THE CHURCH OF ST MARY MAGDALENE

Communion Sentence: *This is my body which is given for you: this cup is the new testament in my blood, saith the Lord: this do ye as oft as ye drink it in remembrance of me.* (Choir: Psalm 22: 1-6)

After all have received communion, we sit in silent thanksgiving.

The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.

Procession of the Blessed Sacrament to the Altar of Repose

Hymn 268 (*Green hymn book. Please kneel.*)

PANGE LINGUA, MODE III

(Verses 5 & 6 are sung at the Altar of Repose)

The Stripping and Washing of the Altars

Antiphon: (*read by all*): **They parted my garments among them and cast lots upon my vesture.**

Psalm 22 (*Small red book-page 354 - read alternately*)

Gospel Reading: Matthew 26: 30-46

Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.

We praise thee, we bless thee, we thank thee, and we pray to thee, Lord our God.

At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:

All: **Our Father, who art in heaven:**

Hallowed be thy name:

Thy Kingdom come:

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread.

And forgive us our trespasses,

as we forgive those who trespass against us.

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

For thine is the Kingdom,

the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast.**

Prayer of Humble Access

Celebrant: We do not presume

All: **to come to this thy table, O merciful Lord,**

Trusting in our own righteousness,

but in thy manifold and great mercies.

We are not worthy so much as to gather up the crumbs under thy table.

But thou art the same Lord, whose property is always to have mercy:

Grant us therefore, gracious Lord,

so to eat the flesh of thy dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood,

That we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

The Solemn Liturgy of Maundy Thursday – 6.00 pm

Welcome to the Church of St. Mary Magdalene.

We hope that the liturgy will assist you in prayer and the worship of God. This parish's liturgical tradition is centred in the richness of the catholic expression within the Anglican tradition. This order of service will help you participate in the celebration of the mass. **Hymns** are taken either from the **green hymn book** in the pews or from the **blue book** you have been given. **Service music** is also found in the blue book and the texts are printed in this leaflet. All who are baptized with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive Holy Communion in the Anglican Church.

The Gathering of the Community

(Please stand until the end of the Introduction, and then sit for the footwashing, during which the choir sings antiphons. At the end of the footwashing, please stand.)

(The Kiss of Peace is omitted because Jesus was betrayed with a kiss on this night.)

The Celebration of the Eucharist

During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.

Offertory Sentence: *Ubi Caritas*

PLAINCHANT

Where charity and love are, there is God. The love of Christ hath joined us in me. Let us rejoice, and be glad in him. Let us fear, and let us loving the living God. The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue Book No. 116*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer A. You may follow the text on page 143 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue Book.
