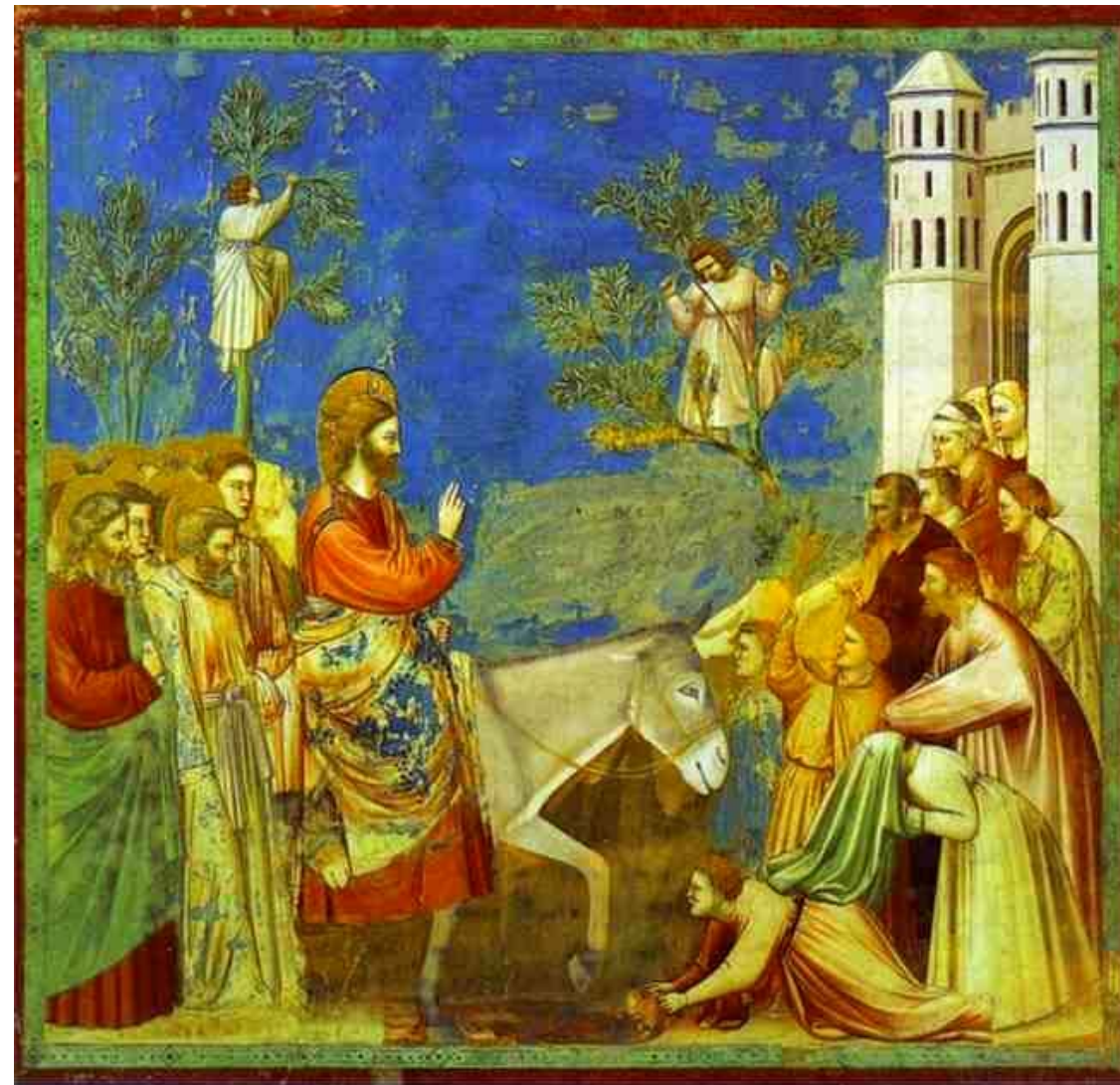

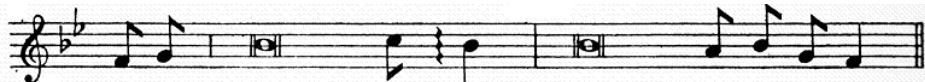
Antiphon: *Hosanna to the Son of David*

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:

Thy Kingdom come:

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven.

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the

Kingdom, the power and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

Celebrant: Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us;

People: **Therefore, let us keep the feast.**

C: When I consider thy heavens, even the work of thy **fin**-gers : the moon and the stars which thou **hast** or-dain-ed.

P: What is a man, that thou art mindful of him : and the son of man, that thou vi-si test him?

C: Thou hast made him but little lower than the **an**-gels : and dost crown him with glo-ry and wor-ship.

P: Thou makest him to have dominion over the works of thy hands : and thou hast put all things in subjection un-der his feet;

C: All sheep and **ox**-en : yea, and **beasts** of the field.

The Proclamation of the Word of God

First Reading: Isaiah 50: 4-9a

Lector: Miles O'Reilly

Lector: The word of the Lord. People: **Thanks be to God.**

Tract: Psalm 22: 1-13



C. MY GOD, my God, why hast thou for-sa-ken^me : and art so far from my health, and from the words of my^com-plaint?

P. **O my God, I cry in the daytime, but thou hearest not : and in the night-season also I take^no rest.**

C. And thou continuest ho-ly : O thou worship of Is^ra-el.

P. **Our fa-thers hoped in thee : they trusted in thee, and thou didst de-li^ver them.**

C. They called upon thee, and were hol-pen : they put their trust in thee, and were not con-found-ed.

P. **But as for me, I am a worm and no man : a very scorn of men, and the outcast of the peo-ple.**

C. All they that see me laugh me to scorn : they shoot out their lips and shake their hēads, saying:

P. **He trusted in God that he would de-li-ver him : let him deliver him, if he will have him.**

C. They stand staring and looking up-on me : they part my garments among them, and cast lots upon my ves-ture.

P. **Save me from the lion's mouth : thou hast heard me also from among the horns of the u^ni-corns.**

C. O praise the Lord, ye that fear him : magnify them, all ye of the seed of Ja-cob.

P. **My seed shall serve him : they shall be counted unto the Lord for a ge-ne-ra-tion.**

C. They shall come, and the heavens shall declare his right-eous-ness : **unto a people that shall be born, whom the Lord^hath made.**
