### The Gathering of the Community

### Confession and Absolution

*The celebrant invites the people to confession. Please kneel or remain standing.*

Celebrant: Most merciful God,  
**All:** we confess that we have sinned against you  
in thought, word, and deed,  
by what we have done,  
and by what we have left undone.  
We have not loved you with our whole heart;  
we have not loved our neighbours as ourselves.  
We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.  
For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ,  
have mercy on us and forgive us,  
that we may delight in your will,  
and walk in your ways,  
to the glory of your name. Amen.

*The celebrant pronounces absolution, after which all stand.*

### The Peace

Celebrant: The peace of the Lord be always with you. **People: And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. **People: We lift them to the Lord.**  
Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*The celebrant continues to pray the Eucharistic Prayer.*

**Holy, Holy, Holy** (*Music: Blue SMM Book No. 95*)

Holy, holy, holy, God of power and might,  
Heaven is filled with glory, earth is filled with light.  
He who comes is blessed, blessed in the Lord,
