The Communion

The community gathers in the aisles to receive communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms across your chest. We remain standing until all have received communion, and then return to our places and sit in silent thanksgiving.

The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.

The Great Thanksgiving (*Music: Blue SMM Book No. 87*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And also with you.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them to the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People: **It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic #3. You may follow the text on page 131 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue SMM Book.
