## The Communion

*You may stand or kneel to receive communion. If you prefer to receive a blessing, please indicate this to the priest by crossing your arms across your chest.*

**Communion Sentence:** *He that eateth my flesh, and drinketh my blood, dwelleth in me, and I in him, saith the Lord. (Choir: Hymn 268 part 1; Psalm 116)*

*After all have received communion, we sit in silent thanksgiving.*

*The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.*

*(Please kneel when the Sanctus bells ring and remain kneeling until joining the procession, if you are able. During the procession we sing hymns from the **special music booklet** provided.)*

**Offertory Hymn 295** (*Green New English Hymnal*)

PICARDY

*During the hymn the bread and wine are presented and an offering is taken to support the life and work of this parish and the wider Church. Please sit when the hymn is finished and remain seated until after the Motet.*

**Offertory Sentence:** *Portas caeli aperuit Dominus: et pluit illis manna, ut ederent: panem caeli dedit illis: panem angelorum manducavit homo, alleluia.* (The Lord opened the gates of heaven; and rained down manna for them and they ate: he gave them the bread of heaven; mortals ate the bread of angels, alleluia)

Celebrant: Pray, my brothers and sisters, that this my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the Father Almighty.

People: **The Lord receive this sacrifice at thy hands, to the praise and glory of his holy name, to our benefit and that of all his holy Church.**

*The celebrant prays the Prayer over the Gifts.*

**The Great Thanksgiving** (*Music: Blue SMM Book No. 116*)

Celebrant: The Lord be with you. People: **And with thy spirit.**

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. People: **We lift them up unto the Lord.**

Celebrant: Let us give thanks unto our Lord God.

People: **It is meet and right so do to.**

*The celebrant continues to pray Eucharistic Prayer B. You may follow the text on page 145 in the "Liturgies" section of the Blue SMM Book.*

### **Sanctus**

*Please kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.*

*At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.*

Celebrant: As now as our Saviour Christ hath taught us, we are bold to say:
