### The Gathering of the Community

### The Sending Forth of the Community

*The celebrant prays the Prayer after Communion.*

Celebrant: Glory to God,  
All: **whose power, working in us,  
can do infinitely more  
than we can ask or imagine.  
Glory to God from generation to generation,  
in the Church and in Christ Jesus,  
for ever and ever. Amen.**

C: The voice of the Lord breaks the ce-dar-trees : the Lord breaks the cedars of Lé-ban-on.

**P: He makes Lebanon to skip like a calf : and Mount Hermon like a yóung wild ox.**

C: The voice of the Lord splits the flames of fire; the voice of the Lord shakes the wilderness : the Lord shakes the wilder-ness of Ka-desh.

Celebrant: Lift up your hearts. **People: We lift them to the Lord.**  
Celebrant: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.  
**People: It is right to give our thanks and praise.**

*The celebrant continues to pray the Eucharistic Prayer.*

### Sanctus (*Music: Blue SMM Book No. 74*)

**Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might,  
Heaven and earth are full of your glory.  
Hosanna in the highest.  
Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord.  
Hosaana in the highest.**

*Please remain standing or kneel. The Eucharistic Prayer continues.*

Celebrant: Therefore, Father, according to his command,  
**All: we remember his death, we proclaim his resurrection, we await his coming  
in glory.**

*At the end of the prayer all respond: Amen.*

Celebrant: As our Saviour taught us let us pray.  
**All: Our Father in heaven, hallowed be your name,  
your kingdom come, your will be done,  
on earth as in heaven.**
