- On Saturday, **12 April**, Faith and the Common Good is holding **Greening Sacred Spaces**: a forum on how faith communities can contribute to creating a more peaceful, healthy, and eco-sustainable world. We welcome today into the fellowship of the Body of Christ by Holy Baptism, Claudia Linda Van Duinen, who has been singing in the 9.30 Mass Choir for a couple of years.

When the disciples asked Christ to explain his departure and return, he did not explain the nature of these mysterious events, but he stated the principle or purpose of them. No birth, he says, without the pains of travail, but the birth of the child is well worth the pains. Unless we agonise at some time over the birth of faith, faith is not ours, it is not a personal possession, it is not the child of our own soul. Christ leaves his disciples so far and so long as is required for the pains of their travail. It is not an act of desertion on his part, but a merciful providence. Darkness and uncertainty, loneliness and spiritual effort are necessary to us, and taken right, they are the growth of faith. They are as much the gifts of God as certainty and comfort. A little while, he says, and I will see you again, and your heart shall rejoice; your joy no man taketh from you.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music by number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.
