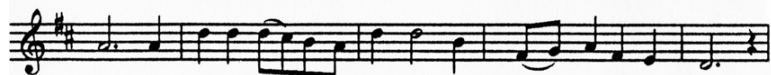

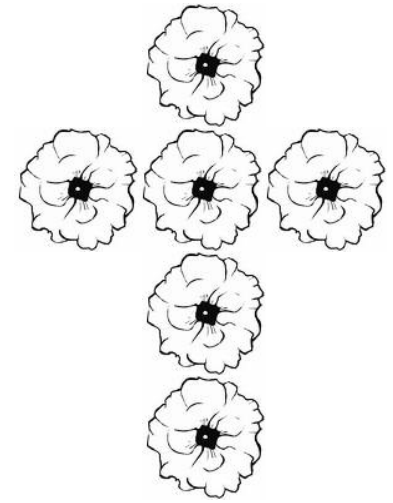

**WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS**

**Visitors** are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music by number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book. All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no longer allowed**. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

**Washrooms** are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.

### Church of St Mary Magdalene, Toronto Sunday, 11 November 2007

Visitors are warmly welcomed and are invited to enjoy refreshments with us after the 9.30 or 11 o'clock Mass.

As you know, **Edith Long**, a life-long parishioner, died on Thursday. Funeral arrangements are pending. Watch the newspapers or contact the church office for final arrangements.

- The **Chant Club** now meets **every Sunday** until 25 November, so as to continue preparing material for the upcoming concert. All interested people are invited to gather in the Choir Room at 1.15pm.
- At 4pm **today** at **Christ Church Deer Park** (1570 Yonge Street) the Choirs of Christ Church Deer Park and the Church of St Mary Magdalene, directed by Bruce Kirkpatrick Hill, present a concert performance of **Mozart's Requiem**. All tickets are \$25 (open seating).
- For the next two weeks there will be a **sale of mystery novels** in Hiscocks Hall after both the 9.30 and 11am Masses. Hardcovers cost \$3; paperbacks are \$1 each or three for \$2.
- The **Meditation Group** will meet on Monday, **12 November**, following the 6.00pm Mass. Meditation will be followed by a light meal. All are welcome.
- The **Fundraising Committee** will meet on Monday, **12 November**, at 7.30pm in the lounge.
- **Parkdale Deanery will hold an information meeting** on Wednesday, **14 November** at St. Thomas's Church, 383 Huron St., in the parish hall, from **7.30 to 9.30pm**. The purpose of this meeting is to give an update on the Parkdale Deanery process, to gain ongoing commitment to this continuing process, and to gain input regarding future interests and initiatives. Our area bishop, Philip Poole, will be present, as will members of the **Parkdale Ministry Development Council (PMDC)**. See the green handout for more information.
- On the weekend of **24-25 November**, we will celebrate 86 years of Gregorian chant in this parish with our **Second Annual Festival of Chant**. **Saturday** will be devoted to a **symposium**, which will offer various seminars in chant. Registration will cost \$15 (which includes a light lunch) and all are welcome. The **Festival of Chant concert** on **Sunday at 4.30pm** will feature our Ritual Choir, Schola Magdalene, Sarum Schola, the SMM Chant Club, and Assistant Organist Andrew Adair. Tickets are \$10 (\$5 for seniors and students) and may be reserved through the church office.

- On Sunday, **2 December** (Advent I) the parish will be holding its **Annual Bake Sale** in Hiscocks Hall after the 9.30 and 11.00 Masses. Delicacies of all sorts will be on sale, as well as Christmas decorations. If you would like to help by baking or staffing a table, please speak with Eva Martin at (416) 923-9333.

As most of you know, the **Thrift Shop** has been closed for a few months now. Parishioners interested in the ministry that the shop offered met recently to discuss the future. It was decided that we would try to recruit more people to help with the shop and form two-person teams, so that each team will have to care for the shop only once a month. Please consider whether you are able to help.

The Thrift Shop started in the 1950s to help the new immigrants into this area. The good used clothes are sold very cheaply and in certain cases given away free of charge. This has been this parish's longest outreach ministry and it would be sad to see it end. It depends upon you. HJN+
