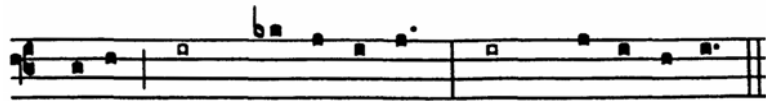

This afternoon **Solemn Evensong and Benediction** will be celebrated at 4.30pm. All are welcome to join in worship.

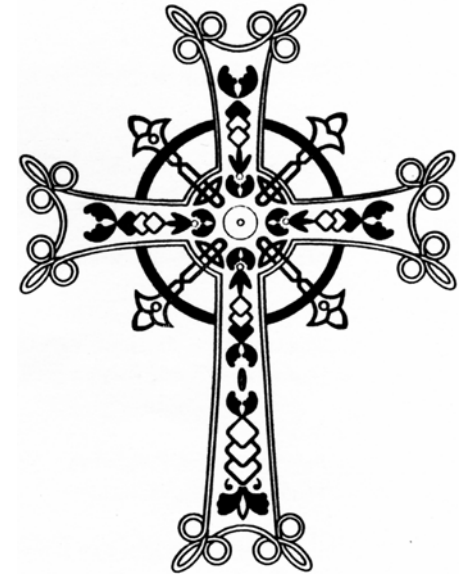


WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Mattins and Evening Prayer are normally said in the church on weekdays at 9:00 am and 5:30 pm, except for Wednesday and Saturday when Mattins is said at 9:30 am. **Sacrament of Anointing for healing of the sick** - first Sunday of the month.

Visitors are warmly welcomed and are invited to enjoy refreshments with us after the 9.30 or 11 o'clock Mass downstairs in Hiscocks Hall.

- Fr Harold is taking his post-Christmas break this week and will return Sunday, 18 March. In his absence, Fr Tay is in charge of the parish.
- Brin will be away from the office on 13 and 14 March, but messages may be left by phone or at office@stmarymagdalene.ca.
- Please note a change in deadline: **announcements or information** concerning the Sunday leaflet should be submitted by **noon on Thursday**.
- The **Meditation Group** meets each Monday during Lent immediately after the 6.00pm Mass. Please feel free to participate as an occasional or regular member. Reflection and meditation are followed by a light supper.
- The **Advisory Board** will meet on **Tuesday, 13 March** following Mass at 7.00pm.
- This Lent Fr Tay leads a discussion group entitled "**Into the Heart of Prayer**," on Wednesday evenings at 7.30pm. We explore both our own experiences of prayer and those of our spiritual fathers and mothers. Themes include private devotional prayer, liturgical prayer, mystical styles of prayer, praying with icons and other images, praying with music, and others. All are welcome to attend as many sessions as they can!
- **Stations of the Cross** every **Friday** in Lent at **8.00 pm** is a devotional remembrance of the passion of Our Lord. It takes about 50 minutes.
- The **confirmation group** will meet on **Saturday, 17 March** at 1.00pm.
- The monks of **Holy Cross Priory** are sponsoring a **Day of Quiet and Prayer** from 9:00 a.m. to 2 p.m on **Saturday, 17 March** to explore the meaning of our Lenten journey. The Priory is located at 204 High Park Avenue. If you would like to attend please phone (416) 767-9081 or send an

email to vaggione@rogers.com. Bring a bag lunch (beverages will be provided). There is no set charge but donations are always appreciated.

• **Lent is FaithWorks season at SMM.** FaithWorks is a diocesan-wide fundraising effort to support designated social service charities that have a connection with the Anglican Church. Every Anglican in the Diocese of Toronto is being asked for a donation to support the work of these agencies to help the needy of this diocese and even worldwide, since the Primate's World Relief and Development Fund is given grants from this fund. Fifteen percent of the proceeds from each parish is retained by the parish to fund the parish's efforts in social service ministry. Material about FaithWorks is included with this leaflet. We hope that you will consider carefully and prayerfully your gift to the appeal and mark your envelopes accordingly, or use a pew envelope.

The **Annual FaithWorks Lunch**, prepared and sponsored by Veronica Allen, will be held on Mothering Sunday, **18 March**, at 12.30pm in Hiscocks Hall. Tickets are available downstairs after the Solemn Mass. The cost is \$12 per person and \$28 for a family of four with children under 12. Proceeds go to the FaithWorks Appeal.

• On Tuesday, **20 March** at 7.00pm there will be a film presentation and panel discussion in celebration of **World Water Day**, presented as part of an education and action campaign on **Water as a Human Right** by KAIROS: Canadian Ecumenical Justice Initiatives and other social justice and environmental groups. The event is free and will be held at Innis Town Hall in Innis College, University of Toronto.

• The **Parish Quiet Day** will be held on **Saturday, 24 March** beginning with Mass at 10.00am and will be led by the Rev'd Dana Fisher, Chaplain, Trinity College.



• The **Second Century Renewal Fund** continues in its efforts to raise approximately \$350 000. for improvements to the church building and grounds: removing the plywood from the windows outside at the east and west ends of the building and replacing it with glass; installing a hardwood floor over the existing softwood sub-floor; replacing the two central sets of doors with doors with glass in them; installing a proper fence outside; and improving the existing sound system. We hope that we can finish this project in 2008 when we celebrate the centenary of the completion of this building. It is hoped that every parishioner will make a three year pledge for a substantial amount to support this necessary work.



Everything that is true of Christ's body is true of us in some manner. He gives us his body that we may become his body. Christ's body died on the cross, he also rose. The resurrection is ours, but the death also is ours. Many men, at the last challenge, have consented to be martyrs, and set their bodies aside. But Christ's passion was no more than the last expression of what he had done all his life. He had set his body aside whenever its demands conflicted with man's need or God's will, and so he had rehearsed his death continually; not morbidly, but with joy and self-forgetfulness. We have many opportunities so to rehearse our death, and how steadily we reject them! Our bed, our chair retains us when we should get up and pray; fleshly delights of act and imagination, some by no means innocent, hold us from following better inspirations. Our own pleasure comes before our neighbour's, vanity before sympathy. How will it be when rehearsals are over, and we have to act our part, to put our bodies finally off, that we may possess God? If Christ offers us up with his own death in this sacrament, it is that we may die a voluntary and daily death, and merit a daily resurrection.
