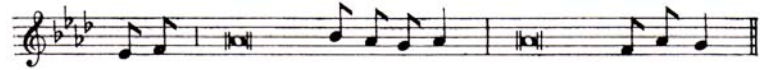

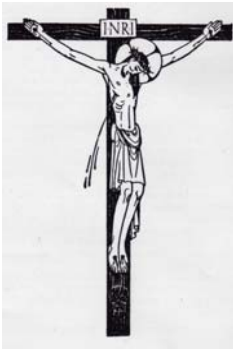

Christians are not dualists who believe that matter is intrinsically evil, and therefore all God's created universe, material and spiritual, counts for us. The whole of life is important, political, economic and social, and none of these aspects is untouched by religion as we understand it. – Archbishop Desmond Tutu

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music** by **number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

With a single colour in the church, these features can sometimes feel quite lost. You will note two different colours and two different stylistic approaches.
