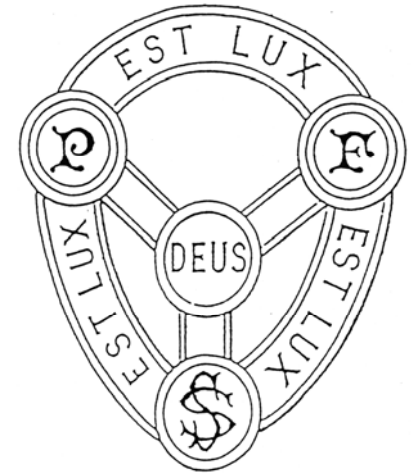
At **4.30 this afternoon** we will celebrate **Solemn Evensong and Benediction**. All are invited to join in worship.

Evening Prayer or Evensong is one of the two official offices or liturgies of prayer and praise in the Anglican Church. This is purely an offering of our worship to Almighty God in thanksgiving for all that God has done for the human race. Added to this 'office' is Benediction, an extension of Jesus Christ's sacramental presence among us in worship, and the blessing at the end with the consecrated bread of the Eucharist.

The disciples who were present at the Supper saw and heard Jesus Christ making eucharist to the Father over the bread and the cup. They were witnesses of the intercourse between the Eternal Son and his Eternal Father. Mortal ears and eyes at that moment perceived the movement of speech and love which passes in the heart of the Godhead; human minds entered into that converse of the Divine Persons which is the life and happiness of the Blessèd Trinity. Belief in the Trinity is not a distant speculation; the Trinity is that blessèd family into which we are adopted. God has asked us into his house, he has spread his table before us, he has set out bread and wine. We are made one body with the Son of God, and in him converse with the Eternal Father, through the indwelling of the Holy Ghost.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion. **Washrooms** are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.



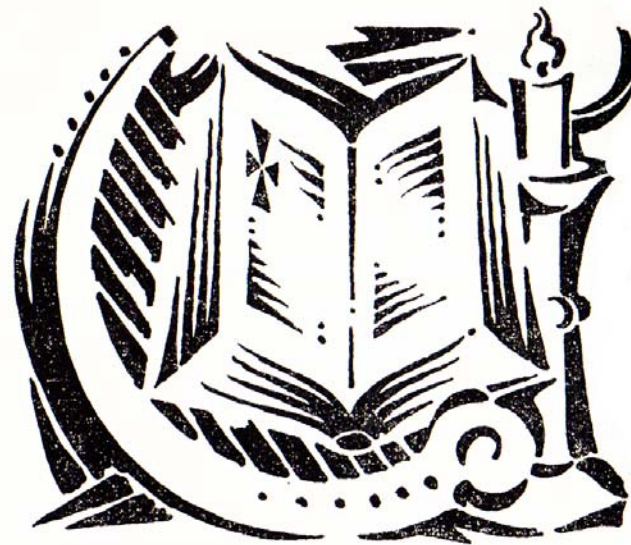
