WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. Full music hymn books, or large print hymn books are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music** by **number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion. **Washrooms** are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.
