WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex.

Full music hymn books, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music** by **number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book. All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.

If we pay little or no attention to God throughout the week we shall naturally find it difficult, and even impossible, to throw ourselves heart and soul into the central act of worship of the Church on Sunday. If our prayers are brief and perfunctory; or if we meditate on the truths of the Christian faith rarely or spasmodically, or perhaps not at all; if we are more concerned with our own affairs, our duties and pleasures and interests than with God – it stands to reason that it will be very difficult to worship truly when we do go to Church, and still more, at the Eucharist.

We know that we are not saints, and that often their expressions of delight in worship leave us cold. It is no use running away from the truth about ourselves by saying, 'After all, I am made that way! I am not spiritual.' We were made for God, and if we do not bring Him the worship and love that He desires, we are grieving and disobeying Him, and losing our own souls into the bargain. Indeed, we are missing the whole meaning of life, both for ourselves, and for the service we might render to our fellows....
