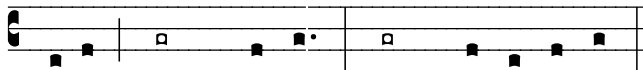

However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no longer allowed**. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

- **Parkdale Deanery will be holding information meetings** on two successive Wednesdays, **7 November** (St. Anne's Church, 270 Gladstone, in the parish hall) and **14 November** (St. Thomas's Church, 383 Huron St., in the parish hall) from **7.30 to 9.30pm** each evening. The purpose of this meeting is to give an update on the Parkdale Deanery process, to gain ongoing commitment to this continuing process, and to gain input regarding future interests and initiatives. Our area bishop Philip Poole will be present, as will members of the **Parkdale Ministry Development Council** (PMDC). **Today** Heather McGregor and Brian Clarke will speak to the 9.30 and 11.00 Masses about the Parkdale Deanery process. More information can be found at the end of these announcements.
- The **Meditation Group** will meet on Monday, **29 October**, following the 6.00pm Mass. Meditation will be followed by a light meal. All are welcome.
- This week the **Feast of All Saints**, Thursday, **1 November**, is one of the great festivals of the Church's year. Accordingly we celebrate it here at S.M.M. with three Masses at 7.15am, 10.00am (in Italian with readings in English) and 6.00pm so that as many parishioners as possible can find a convenient time to participate in a Mass. After the Procession and Solemn Mass at 6.00pm we shall have a **potluck supper** to which everyone is invited to bring some item of food or refreshment.
- Friday, **2 November** is **All Souls Day**, when Catholic Christians remember at Mass all their relatives and friends who have died. There are three Requiem Masses: at 7.15am, at 10.00am and at 6.00pm a Solemn Requiem Mass. On this day we pray to God for all those whom we love who have died and live in the nearer presence of God. Just as we pray for friends far away, so we pray for relatives and friends who have died, asking God, as the Book of Common Prayer says, to "Grant them thy peace; and in thy loving wisdom and almighty power, work in them the good purpose of thy perfect will".

More Information About Parkdale Deanery:

Bishop Poole established the **Parkdale Ministry Development Council** in response to the recommendations made by the Commission on Ministry in Parkdale. The Commission consulted widely with the parishes in Parkdale Deanery, and the formation of the PMDC allows us to address the various issues facing the parishes in the deanery. This opportunity will not likely occur again unless we embrace it. Some of the parishes in the deanery are in crisis. All of us need to develop new forms of ministry in order to meet the spiritual needs of our community. And to address both these issues we will need to collaborate with one another.

At this point, each vestry in our Deanery has been asked to consider the following motion: "That Vestry approve its participation in the Parkdale Deanery Development Council and support its principles and membership.

It is Bishop Poole's wish that each parish call a special vestry to consider this motion before the end of this year. Some parishes will need to make decisions concerning their future sooner rather than later. All of us need to plan for the future. If we wish to participate in the decisions that directly affect our deanery this is our opportunity to do so.

As we go forward, PMDC is committed to the following principles. Parishes will continue to be responsible for their own finances and property. It is to be hoped, however, that the continued existence of the PMDC will help parishes to explore partnerships (we at SMM already partner with other parishes for the Out of the Cold programme), in addition to expanding their own mission and presence, whenever possible. These partnerships could result in an integration of ministries and administration or some other configuration that facilitates collaboration. Any changes in governance or finances will require vestry approval. Each parish will have one member of clergy and two lay delegates on the PMDC. Members of the PMDC will continue to liaise with their parish corporations and advisory boards.

Lay leadership and participation will be essential to expand the Anglican presence and mission in Parkdale. Members of SMM who are interested in this ministry are invited to attend either of the November meetings. If you plan to attend please contact either Father Harold, one of the wardens, or Heather McGregor or Brian Clarke.
