- The **Chant Club** now meets **every Sunday** until 25 November, so as to continue preparing material for the upcoming concert. All interested people are invited to gather in the Choir Room at 1.15pm.
- Today at **4.30pm Solemn Evensong and Benediction** will be sung, followed by a **potluck supper** for all those who care for or participate in the work of the sanctuary.

- **Parkdale Deanery will be holding information meetings** on two successive Wednesdays, **7 November** (St. Anne's Church, 270 Gladstone, in the parish hall) and **14 November** (St. Thomas's Church, 383 Huron St., in the parish hall) from **7.30 to 9.30pm** each evening. The purpose of this meeting is to give an update on the Parkdale Deanery process, to gain ongoing commitment to this continuing process, and to gain input regarding future interests and initiatives. As most of you know, the **Thrift Shop** has been closed for a few months now. Last Saturday, parishioners interested in the ministry that the shop offered met to discuss the future. It was decided that for the next three weeks we would try to recruit more people to help with the shop and form two-person teams, so that each team will have to care for the shop only once a month. Please consider whether you are able to help.

The Thrift Shop started in the 1950s to help the new immigrants into this area. The good used clothes are sold very cheaply and in certain cases given away free of charge. This has been this parish's longest outreach ministry and it would be sad to see it end. It depends upon you. HJN+

- For the next three weeks there will be a **sale of mystery novels** in Hiscocks Hall after both the 9.30 and 11am Masses. Hardcover costs \$3; paperbacks are \$1 each or three for \$2.

- On 12 November Fr Murray Belway will be returning to Ghana, where he has started an almond and mango grove to help the local people. He is planning to create the **Fr Donald Belway Mango Sanctuary** there, and friends are invited to assist him by purchasing a tree (\$10) and/or contributing to the cost of watering it until it is established (\$100). You are welcome to contribute any amount you wish; for more information, speak with Eva Martin.

- As you know, the parish has committed itself to carry out certain **renovations to the church building** including a new hardwood floor throughout; open windows at the east and west end of the church and dealing with the sunlight in the east windows; new main entrance doors with glass; a new fence; and a new large sign on the front lawn. All of this is estimated to cost about \$475,000.00. Pledges of about \$300,000 have been received to date. We are asking all members of the parish as well as friends of the parish to support this project with a **three-year**

**pledge or a one-time gift.** We hope that you will respond with your support. It is our hope that these changes will not merely benefit our people and our building, but will also be attracting to the people of our neighbourhood.
