All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity
are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican
Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and
wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the
wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive
communion.

Visitors are warmly welcomed and are invited to enjoy **refreshments** with us in Hiscocks Hall (downstairs) after Mass.

- It is with great pleasure that we announce that **the Gallery Choir won the CBC Choral Competition** on Wednesday! Our congratulations are offered to our Director of Music, Stephanie Martin, and all the members of the choir for their hard work and their achievement. This win means that the Gallery Choir will go to Montreal on the May long weekend for the final phase of the competition.
- Further to the recent update from the Building Committee, the Wardens are proposing an **information meeting today at 10.30am and at 12.45 pm** and a **special Vestry meeting on 11 May at 1pm** to discuss two items related to the Second Century renewal project that were discussed last year, considered through preliminary designs, but not officially approved last June by Vestry. They are:
 - (1) **the design of interior glass doors for the main entrance into the Church from the Narthex.**
 - (2) **the design of outdoor landscaping on the west side of the Church, apart from improvements to the main stairs and walkway.**

Re (1): the design that has attracted support from the Building Committee involves full-length glass doors so that persons passing by the Church could see considerable light coming from and through the new entrance doors.

Re (2): the design to date resembles the design found in the posters on this project at the back of the Church; however, we are in the process of receiving preliminary comments from the City and expect to be able to advise Vestry how such comments may require changes to our preliminary design.
- The **Spring Plant Sale** will take place on **Saturday, 10 May** (10-1 p.m.) and **Sunday, 11 May** (after the liturgies). The Plant Sale is held every spring in support of parish outreach. Do you have houseplants or perennials from your garden you would like to donate? Please speak to David Greig or call him at 416-252-3504.
- This **Saturday, 10 May**, the **Marian Festival** will convene at St. Thomas' Church, Huron Street, at 10.00am to celebrate Solemn Mass, with refreshments to follow. All are welcome.
- The devotional booklet "**Day by Day**" for the next quarter is available on the tract case. It provides a meditation on a passage of scripture for each day and other passages of scripture to read. It costs only two dollars.
- On **Tuesday, 13 May** there will be a public reading of the **Short Text of Julian of Norwich** at Church of the Redeemer at Bloor and Avenue Road at 7 p.m. It

will be introduced by two Julian scholars and features a dozen readers, including Ms. Rosemary Beattie of St. Mary Magdalene's. For more information visit www.theredeemer.ca

Confessions will be heard in the church on Saturday by Fr Nahabedian from 5.00 to 5.30 pm or at other times by appointment. Mattins and Evening Prayer are normally said in the church on weekdays at 9:00 am and 5:30 pm, except for Wednesday and Saturday when Mattins is said at 9:30 am. **Sacrament of Anointing for healing of the sick** - first Sunday of the month.

As outlined by the Wardens previously, another theft occurred from the Warden's office after Easter.
