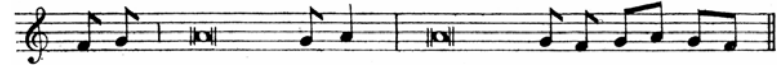

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music by number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.

- **Fr Harold is taking his annual holiday this month.** He returns 1 September.
 - **Fr Moss will be leaving the parish** at the end of the summer. We will bid him farewell on **Holy Cross Day**, 14 September, and wish him well as he moves into the role of Rector at the Church of the Messiah.
 - This summer at the Solemn Mass our Director of Music, Prof. Martin, has decided to **continue the participation of the Gallery Choir**, on a voluntary basis, throughout the summer. The **Sanctus**, however, is set to plainsong which the congregation can join in singing using the music provided on the cream-coloured insert.
 - Please remember if you are on your annual holiday this summer that it **should not be a holiday from worship**. It is a great witness to the Faith, and to the local faithful, when we seek out on Sunday the Christian community wherever we are and worship with them, always trying to celebrate the Eucharist if at all possible.
- Parishioners are also reminded that the Wardens and the Treasurer would appreciate your **keeping your pledges up-to-date**, as the bills keep coming in during the summer holidays. It is less worrisome for them when there is enough money in the bank to pay the bills.HJN+
