Lessons: Numbers 14: 26-45, Matthew 19: 23-30

It has often seemed unreasonable that there should be more joy in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine just men in need of no repentance, as though we gave most joy to the heart of God by often sinning and repenting often. But God has no joy in insincere repentances, and to repent sincerely is to repent, so far as we can make it, irrevocably. It is not for us to theorise repentance, but to repent; we at least are sinners, and we can give to the heart of God the joy he prizes so, for we can repent. Especially since the careful searching fingers are stretched from heaven to find the missing silver, and the love of God does not rest from seeking the lost sheep. How, in fact, was Jesus seen to be seeking the sinful publicans? He sat and ate with them. And he is seen to be seeking us, in that he has drawn us to share his table. - Austin Farrer

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books, or large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music** by **number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book.

All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Washrooms are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.

Hand sanitizers for your use are available on both sides of the church near the central door.
