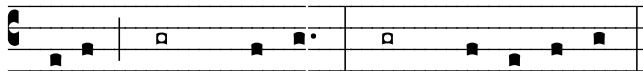

One night, a man came to our house to tell me that a Hindu family, a family of eight children, had not eaten anything for days. They had nothing to eat.

I took enough rice for a meal and went to their house. I could see the hungry faces, the children with their bulging eyes. The sight could not have been more dramatic!

The mother took the rice from my hands, divided it in half and went out. When she came back a little later, I asked her: "Where did you go? What did you do?"

She answered, "They also are hungry." "They" were the people next door, a Muslim family with the same number of children to feed and who did not have any food either.

That mother was aware of the situation. She had the courage and the love to share her meagre portion of rice with others. In spite of her circumstances, I think she felt very happy to share with her neighbours the little I had taken her.

In order not to take away her happiness, I did not take her any more rice that night. I took her some more the following day.

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music by number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book. All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no longer allowed**. You may kneel or stand to receive communion.

Confessions will be heard in the church on Saturday by Fr Nahabedian from 5.00 to 5.30 pm or at other times by appointment. Mattins and Evening Prayer are normally said in the church on weekdays at 9:00 am and 5:30 pm, except for Wednesday and Saturday when Mattins is said at 9:30 am. **Sacrament of Anointing for healing of the sick** - first Sunday of the month.



Visitors are warmly welcomed and are invited to enjoy refreshments with us **after the 9.30 or 11 o'clock Mass.**

- Tomorrow, **Thanksgiving Monday, 8 October**, Mass will be celebrated at **10.00am** only.

Next Sunday, **14 October**, the Solemnity of the Feast of Dedication will be celebrated following the usual Sunday schedule. As well, **Solemn Evensong and Benediction will be sung at 4.30pm followed by a dinner** being presented by Veronica Allen and friends. **Corey Keeble** will be speaking on the topic "Seven Centuries of Controversy, Scandal and Outrage: The 1432 Magdalene Altar at Tiefenbronn". **Tickets** for the dinner cost \$50.00 including a tax receipt for \$25.00 and admission to the accompanying **silent auction**. Proceeds go to the Second Century Renewal Fund.

- All those interested in **Christian education for children and young people on Sundays** are invited to a meeting regarding the Sunday school programme on Monday, **15 October** at 7.30pm in the lounge.
- Please help in our ongoing organizational efforts by **adding your E-mail address to the list** posted at the back of the church by the end of the month.
- At the main door there is a wicker hamper to receive your **donations of packaged and tinned foods**. (No fresh food, and egg cartons are no longer needed.) This food is regularly taken to St Peter's Anglican Church Food Bank, 188 Carlton St, Toronto M5A 2K8, to support those in need. Cheques can also be sent to them to purchase foodstuffs.
- The parish's **Thrift Shop** is **closed** until further notice. **Please do not bring in any more clothing** for the shop at this time. If there is anyone who is interested in continuing this ministry, please speak to Fr Harold or one of the Wardens.
- **Pink parking cards** are available at the back of the church to place on the dashboard of your car when you are at Mass. These cards remind officers to give consideration to people at worship. However, illegal parking is not allowed and there are no guarantees. If you receive a ticket while at Mass, please show it to a Warden.

- As you know, the parish has committed itself to carry out certain **renovations to the church building** including a new hardwood floor throughout; open windows at the east and west end of the church and dealing with the sunlight in the east windows; new main entrance doors with glass; a new fence; and a new large sign on the front lawn. All of this is estimated to cost about \$475,000.00. Pledges of about \$300,000 have been received to date. We are asking all members of the parish as well as friends of the parish to support this project with a **three-year pledge or a one-time gift**. We hope that you will respond with your support. It is our hope that these changes will not merely benefit our people and our building, but will also be attracting to the people of our neighbourhood.
