given to the sick and poor. Now you bring money. But your
money is still presented along with the bread and wine, and it still

yourselves who are laid on the altar to be consecrated, and to be

WELCOME TO OUR VISITORS

Visitors are invited to sign one of the guest books in the narthex. **Full music hymn books**, or **large print hymn books** are available from sidespersons. The **Blue Book**, which you have, lists **hymns** and **Mass music by number**. The text of the **liturgies** is by **page number** at the back of the book. All who are **baptised** with water in the name of the Holy Trinity are welcome to receive **Holy Communion** in the Anglican Church. **At the time of Communion** you may receive bread and wine **OR** bread only. However, **intinction** (dipping bread into the wine) is **no** longer allowed. You may kneel or stand to receive communion. **Washrooms** are in the basement which can be reached from the door beside the font. There is a **wheelchair-accessible lift and washroom** in the office area. Please speak to one of the sidespersons.

- During **July**, our **parish administrative assistant** (Brin) will be in the office on **Thursdays and Fridays only** from 10am to 3pm. The clergy will continue to keep the office open and answer phone calls as they are able.
- Please remember if you are on your annual holiday this summer that **it should not be a holiday from worship**. It is a great witness to the Faith, and to the local faithful, when we seek out on Sunday the Christian community wherever we are and worship with them, always trying to celebrate the Eucharist if at all possible.
- The parish's **Thrift Shop** is **closed** until further notice. **Please do not bring in any more clothing** for the shop at this time. It is hoped that in September the parish will have an opportunity to consider the future role of the Thrift Shop, if any. If there is anyone who is interested in this ministry, please speak to Fr Harold or one of the Wardens.
- This summer at the Solemn Mass our Director of Music, Prof. Martin, has decided to **continue the participation of the Gallery Choir**, on a voluntary basis, throughout the summer. Please let interested parties know. The **Sanctus**, however, will be set to plainsong which the congregation can join in singing using the music provided in this insert.
