The Nicene Creed CARDINALIS

Likewise after supper he took the cup; and when he had given thanks, he gave it to them, saying, "Drink ye all of this; for this is my blood of the new covenant, which is shed for you and for many for the remission of sins: Do this, as oft as ye shall drink it, for the remembrance of me." Wherefore, O Father, Lord of heaven and earth, we thy humble servants, with all thy holy Church, remembering the precious death of thy beloved Son, his mighty resurrection, and glorious ascension, and looking for his coming again in glory, do make before thee, in this sacrament of the holy bread of eternal life and the cup of everlasting salvation, the memorial which he hath commanded:

The Communion

My Jesus, I believe that you are in the Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I long for you in my soul. Since I cannot now receive you sacramentally, come spiritually into my heart. As though you have already come, I embrace you and unite myself entirely to you; never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.

Communion Sentence

Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God; blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called children of God; blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven. (Following the Communion Sentence, the Ritual Choir sings Psalm 126.)

O God most high, who hast manifested thy glory in the company of all thy saints: We humbly beseech thee to send down the continual dew of thy grace, that we, fulfilling all righteousness in this present time of our pilgrimage, may pass over into the heavenly land of promise, to feast with thy saints at the table of thine eternal life; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.

People: Amen.

The celebrant blesses the people, after which follow any notices and announcements.

Dismissal

Celebrant: Depart in peace. *Response: Thanks be to God.*
